



#### Matthew 14:13-21

#### Jesus Feeds the Five Thousand

When Jesus heard what had happened, he withdrew by boat privately to a solitary place. Hearing of this, the crowds followed him on foot from the towns. When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them and healed their sick.

As evening approached, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a remote place, and it's already getting late. Send the crowds away, so they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food."

Jesus replied, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat."

"We have here only five loaves of bread and two fish," they answered.

"Bring them here to me," he said. And he directed the people to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people. They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over. The number of those who ate was about five thousand men, besides women and children.



### Give Drink to the Thirsty

#### A Global Water Crisis

More than 650 million people throughout the world do not have access to clean water. That means one out of every ten people in the world lives without clean water. Women and children have to walk many miles from home every day carrying large containers of water to drink and to clean. If they were to drink the dirty water nearby, they would become very sick. Dirty water causes more deaths than violence and war. Almost half of these deaths are children under five years old.


