Interactive Seminar exploring Pope Francis' Amoris Laetitia.

The Joy of Love - Amoris Laetitia

Pope Francis is often portrayed as having instigated something of a revolution in Catholic pastoral practice around marriage and family. Has he? In *Amoris Laetitia* he certainly calls for a more understanding and welcoming Church. This seminar session will unpack the groundbreaking document on family life and help participants apply it in their everyday lives.

<u>Parish Leaders:</u> This seminar has been run with 250 teachers in Catholic schools in the Archdiocese. We recommend that it be run as a 2 hour evening session including in that time frame a 15min coffee/tea/biscuits component. Welcomes and Farewells

The Council welcomed two new members, Maria Archer from Richmond and Deacon Danny Karatea-Goddard, Turanga Maori and Te Kahu o te Rangi. Two further members, Falefou Sio and Lauano Atu Ilaoa will be welcomed at the March meeting. The Council also farewelled two long-standing members, Br Doug Dawick, Chair of the Council for three years, and Mika Teofilo, a member since 2010. Both have given so generously of their time and wisdom, and will be greatly missed. The new Chair is Kathryn Miles from Carterton.

Synod Outcomes

Following on from Synod 2017 Cardinal John has asked the Council to reflect on and provide insight for him on nine of the Synod outcomes. The business of the morning centred on two of the outcomes, 2a 'Parishes are supported to develop new and inclusive forms of liturgy/worship (other than the Mass) which reflect the diversity of parish communities and encourage people to re-engage with their faith', and 2e 'The Archdiocese creates and implements a pastoral plan, which takes account of cultural diversity, to ensure a co-ordinated and consistent approach to the spiritual growth of the people'.

Parish Self- Appraisal

The Council has been preparing a Parish Self Appraisal resource to help parishes reflect on their pastoral activity and hopefully to help inform pastoral planning in the future. The resource will incorporate the themes and outcomes of Synod. It is hoped that that the draft will be ready for presentation to the Council of Priests February2018. The idea for a parish resource of this nature emanated first from New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference who then invited each diocese to shape it according to what would be most useful for their faith communities.




Stewardship

The theme for the October Stewardship Month this year was **Go, you are sent to be stewards of creation**, following on from Synod. The Archdiocesan Stewardship Committee prepared resources for parishes to use, including Data Projection stills, Prayers of the Faithful, bulletin inserts, and a one hour prayer reflection for parish groups, based on the themes of *Laudato Si*.

On Saturday November 18 the last of the Stewardship Days for 2017 was held for the Catholic Parish of Wellington South, attracting close to 100 parishioners.
