	reason St Anne's campus, church and hall might be

Factors to be considered as	That parishioners want access to the church, including for Mass is

Safety plan:	Depending on the incident:
	Buildings are to be evacuated.
	No person to enter buildings until the building is 'cleared'. For St
	Joseph's, St Anne's church and St Francis de Sales this means by an

	engineer. For St Bernard's church and St Anne's hall - this may be by an engineer, builder or other person qualified to make an assessment of risk (noting St Anne's hall and St Bernard's church are long standing wooden structures where any damage is or risk is likely to be more evident).
	Consider the St Anne's campus (church and hall) being inspected as THE priority - this provides a substantial welfare capability in an area of need.
Communication plan:	The Parish Leadership Team member taking control of the situation is responsible for approving any communication internally or externally. This establishes 'one source of truth'.
	Communications will be prepared by the person/team allocated that responsibility. This person/team will develop a communication strategy based on the incident and its impact on parishioners and public.

## IMMEDIATE ACTION IN THE CASE OF AN EVENT DURING SERVICE

- 1. The pastoral leader present takes control.
- 2. If a FIRE: direct the evacuation of the building. Phone 111, request fire.
- 3. If an EARTHQUAKE: ask 2 or 3 parishioners to assist form a management team. Ask other parishioners to reassure, provide first aid as required. Management team: quickly assess (gather information, look outside, look for height hazards); form plan, STAY or EVACUATE; direct and reassure.
- 4. A note about evacuation: survivability increases considerably where a leader directs (i.e. commands) the evacuation. In a stentorian voice, tell people what to do. E.G.: "we are about to evacuate the building. Do so in an orderly manner. No pushing. Help others. If we do this we will survive!". Continue to communicate this message.
