A lesson from the children

At this time of year we celebrate with our children as they receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. At a recent Confirmation liturgy the children shared some of what they learnt at the offertory procession as they brought up an interesting assortment of gifts.



We flew **kites** and learned that we cannot see what keeps a kite up in the air when it flies, but we can feel the wind when it blows on our face. The Holy Spirit is like the wind – we cannot see it, but we can hear it whispering to us in our prayer, and we can look back and see the effects in our lives.



When we receive a **gift** – we have to unwrap it to see what the gift is. As we pray, God will reveal the gifts of the Holy Spirit given to each of us.



We did baking and gave it away in a **gift basket**. The gifts of the Spirit are given for us to give away too.



When we were baptised, we were given a **candle** to signify the light of Christ newly received in our life. Tonight the candidates have received another candle to signify that they are now empowered to let the Light of Christ shine in their lives for all to see.



Bread and wine were the food that Jesus shared with his disciples at the Last Supper. We bring them now for God to change the ordinary to the extraordinary, in our Eucharistic feast tonight.

He called a little child to him, and placed the child among them. And he said: "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me." Matthew 18:1-5

Archdiocesan Pastoral Council — June meeting

On Friday evening the Council gathered and reflected on Chapter 1 of *Gaudete et Exsultate*, Pope Francis' 2018 exhortation on The Call to Holiness. This time of prayer and sharing has always been an important part of any weekend's agenda as it centres the Council not only on the business and discernment of the weekend but also the Church it serves.

On Saturday morning Deacon Danny Karatea-Goddard, as **Vicar for Maori**, presented on the future pastoral direction and priorities of Te Kahu o te Rangi, and Turanga Maori, and the paramount importance of the Archdiocese's partnership and collaboration with the plan going forward, for it to succeed. It was a very hopeful presentation and an exciting challenge to all.


The **Parish Self-Review**, created as a post-2017 Synod resource for Parish Pastoral Leadership was approved by the Council, and will be sent to all parishes for their use as soon as it has been formatted as a Word Document. Thirteen Synod data projector slides accompany this resource.

Other agenda items included a discussion on **'what three elements made homilies best for you?'** (Synod Outcome 2h) by way of input into a Clergy Assembly at the end of June, the 20th anniversary of *Ecclesia in Oceania* Synod, preparations for 2018 World Day of the Poor, and two further presentations, one from Chris Duthie-Jung, Director of the **Family and Young Church Vicariate**, who updated the Council on the ongoing work and development of the vicariate, and David Powick, an **AskRight** consultant, who presented on the establishment of the ADW Development Office and its strategic fundraising priorities for mission in the Archdiocese.

Stewardship, a way of life update

Several parishes have requested **Gift Discernment** workshops in the parish setting as part of their ongoing adult parish faith formation. These focus on discerning spiritual gifts and the concept of giftedness for mission. For one parish it preceded a parish offertory renewal, the two working well in tandem.

The four pillars of Stewardship are Hospitality, **Prayer, Formation**, and Service. In light of this Sr Elizabeth Julian sm has created a simple six week prayerful guide introducing parishes to Pope Francis' 2018



exhortation ***Gaudete et Exsultate, The Call to Holiness in Today's World***. Pope Francis writes, "So let me ask you: Are there moments when you place yourself quietly in the Lord's presence, when you calmly spend time with him, when you bask in his gaze? Do you let his fire inflame your heart? Unless you let him warm you more and more with his love and tenderness, you will not catch fire. Mass for the separated and divorced



In his 2016 Apostolic Exhortation *Amoris Laetitia*, Pope Francis describes families as a challenging mosaic, made up of many different realities. He states *'It is my hope that... all will feel called to love and cherish family life, for, families are not a problem, they are first and foremost, an opportunity'*. In this are included the separated and divorced.

In the recent July edition of **WelCom**, an invitation to accompany those affected by divorce and separation was made to all. *'There are many separated and divorced in our parish communities who, because of their circumstances, have felt excluded, shamed and stigmatised.'*

Everyone is urged to invite people in their parish who have been affected by divorce and separation, to gently encourage and possibly accompany them at this Mass. There is an opportunity within our parish communities to support and care for people not mourning the death of a spouse but mourning the death of a dream. In part, it will be 'like-to-like' ministry - those who have walked this path sharing their wisdom. Come and join us to help shape this new ministry.
