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Greeting

Ngā mihi o te Aranga ki a koutou katoa!

Joyful Easter greetings to you all! I hope that during the school holidays you were able to enjoy a slower pace and to find some time to replenish your stocks. I hope too that the new term has found you focused, energised and ready to go!

I would like to begin this term's newsletter with a piece from Pope Francis' Easter message: On this morning of Easter, the perennial youth of the Church and of humanity as a whole, I would like to address each of you in the opening words of my recent Apostolic Exhortation devoted especially to young people:

"Christ is alive! He is our hope, and in a wonderful way he brings youth to our world. Everything he touches becomes young, new, full of life. The very first words, then, that I would like to say to every young Christian are these: Christ is alive, and he wants you to be alive! He is in you, he is with you and he never abandons you. However far you may wander, he is always there, the Risen One. He calls you and he waits for you to return to him and start over again. When you feel you are growing old out of sorrow, resentment or fear, doubt or failure, he will always be there to restore your strength and your hope" (Christus Vivit, 1-2).

As I reflect on Term 1, I am immediately drawn to the memory of the Commissioning Masses in March and to the SLiCS (Servant Leaders in Catholic Schools) Workshops throughout February and March. A key theme in both celebrations was connectedness. It was only a couple of weeks after those Commissioning Masses that we were shocked by the events of March 15 in Christchurch. In the days and weeks that have followed we have seen and heard wonderful stories of connectedness, of aroha and manaakitanga, and of hope. We are continuing to heal and to build that connectedness, and with messages like "They are us" and "I am hope" it's a pretty special time to be alive in the Risen Christ!

I'm really excited too as I look ahead to all that lies in wait for us in Term 2. The main events through this term of course are the Cluster Meetings on Māori Catholic Spirituality with Deacon Danny Karatea-Goddard in May and the ADW Primary DRS Conference in June. There's more information over the next few pages in relation to both of these professional development opportunities. The momentum is building towards the DRS Conference in June. The conference theme is "How beautiful are the footsteps of those who bring good news." It sets a very interesting tone for the conference, particularly around discipleship and witness. I'm looking forward to reflecting on that theme and celebrating our connectedness over the course of the 3 days of the conference.

I conclude with another piece from Pope Francis' Easter message:

Dear brothers and sisters, Christ is alive! He is hope and youth for each of us and for the entire world. May we let ourselves be renewed by him! Happy Easter!

ADW Primary DRS Conference

The DRS Conference is an opportunity for the Directors of Religious Studies from all 37 Catholic Primary Schools in the Archdiocese of Wellington to meet together for collaboration, companionship, nourishment and enrichment. The conference will be held at the Copthorne Hotel and Resort Solway Park in Masterton from Wednesday 12 till Friday 14 June. The conference will begin at 10am on Wednesday (open for registration from 9:30am). The conference will conclude with lunch (12:15pm - 1:15pm) on Friday. A key component of the conference is the ongoing exploration of material critical to the function of the DRS - including the Religious Education Curriculum, the Religious Education Bridging Document, leadership, "The Catholic Education of School-Age Children" and Catholic Character.

Anne Kennedy, Associate Director of NCRS, will lead us in retreat and will present a couple of sessions - on children's spirituality and on the journey to a new RE Curriculum. Fr Cirilo Barlis from Te Awakairangi Parish will join us for Mass on Wednesday afternoon. The ADW Primary DRS Mentoring Programme will be launched at the conference. Certification - Professional Development Records

Following feedback from the March DRS Seminars and subsequent consultation we have decided to trial a new timeframe for the process of applying for Certification in the ADW Catholic Primary Schools.

The process begins with Ginny (CSES Administrator) printing the professional development record for each teacher (current at 31 March). Ginny and I then spend time looking at each record to identify teachers who we believe should apply for a particular level of Certification. This information is highlighted on each individual record and is collated in a school summary sheet. On 31 May Ginny will send to each school their teacher professional development records, summary sheets and application documentation. Schools have until 30 June (1 month) to send in any updates/alterations to individual records - during this time we imagine that DRSs will distribute records to teachers who will check them and return them to their DRS, either confirming that the record is accurate or identifying appropriate professional development which has not been included in their record. Where a record needs to be updated this will be actioned by Ginny and an updated record will be sent to the school. Schools have until 31 September (a further 3 months) to complete the application process - this includes Principal recommendations and RE lesson observations. All applications must be received by CSES before 1 October 2019. Ginny will then process the applications and complete the CSES applications for NCRS. All ADW applications for Certification for 2019 will be presented to NCRS by 31 October 2019.

As you can see, this is a significant process with many steps involving many people. The completion of this process will not change (at this stage anyway) the way that certificates are distributed i.e. all 2019 certificates be distributed at the 2020 Commissioning Masses. Naturally, being a trial, we are very keen to receive your feedback and would welcome such thoughts at any time throughout the process (please send it to us in an email so that we have a record of all feedback). We will most likely send out an electronic evaluation form at the end of the process to formally collect your feedback before making a decision moving beyond 2019.

We appreciate your patient support and understanding as we try to better meet your needs throughout the Certification process.

<u>Catholic Schools Day - Tuesday 28 May 2019</u> [Extending Christ's Call: to love, to be, to do]

Having Life to the Full

A Catholic Course in Human Sexuality (grounded in John 10:10)

The purpose of this course is to explore Catholic teaching in the area of human sexuality including how this fits in the primary and secondary school classroom. The feedback we receive from participants consistently highlights the value of this course for both personal formation and professional development. The course content includes 'The Nature of Christian Love', 'Virtues and Values' and 'Morality and Conscience' before spending time exploring Church teaching in relation to some specific issues of human sexuality such as 'Gender', 'Homosexuality' and 'Pornography'.

In 2019 we will present the new "Having Life to the Full" course in the Archdiocese of Wellington for the first time. I strongly encourage school leaders to consider this course within your plans for professional development for 2019. Sessions will be held at St Bernard's College in Lower Hutt between June and October - details are available here including information for registration.

This course supports teachers as they meet the Ministry of Education requirement to teach Sexuality Education: "Sexuality education is one of seven key areas of learning in the health and physical education learning area of *The New Zealand Curriculum*. It must be included in teaching programmes at both primary and secondary school levels, using the strands and achievement objectives outlined in the curriculum." Teaching Sexuality Education is required from Level 1 of *The New Zealand Curriculum*. This course provides teachers with formation and resources to ensure that their teaching is consistent with the Special Catholic Character of our schools.

Evaluations and Feedback

Your feedback is vitally important in the life and work of CSES. When you complete a course evaluation, we read it, collate it and present it in summary form to Jenny Gordon (Vicar for Education) who in turn shares it with Cardinal John. Your feedback tells Cardinal John (and the rest of us on the way) how we are or are not meeting your needs. Please look at the evaluation as a key element of all CSES professional development sessions and encourage your staff to do so too. Please continue to be as honest and informative as you can when completing evaluation forms. We really are interested in what you have to say.

Targeted Schoolwide Professional Development

If there is a need among your staff for some personalised or targeted schoolwide professional development in Religious Education or Catholic Character, please give me a call or send me an email. I really enjoy working in partnership with DRSs and Principals to prepare and deliver a programme of professional development (perhaps a series of staff meetings) to support our teachers.

You may like to analyse your teacher professional development records once they are distributed at the end of this month to identify any opportunities for staff development, or your ideas may be informed by your annual internal evaluation. I'm also really happy to work with you to address areas which are identified through the external review process.
