Rector's Message

Dear friends of Holy Cross Seminary,

A man was once riding a galloping horse. As the horse and rider thundered past, a woman standing by a gate called out, "Where are you going?" As he flashed by the rider yelled, "Don't ask me, ask the horse!" This reminds me of how we can get caught up in non-stop activity and be led in a direction that we might be better not going in.

Thomas Moore, author of 'Care of the Soul' has written about the dangers of excessive noise and incessant activity: "If we are noisy and active all the time, we will never know the invisible world that is interior to us and to everything. It's no accident that a church or temple might be a place where you can discover the forceful strength and healing power of quiet and stillness."

Holy Cross Seminary seeks to form seminarians in interior silence. This is an important practice for spiritual growth, a deeper relationship with Christ and helping to teach others to pray. Jesus took time out to pray. We do not have to go into a church to pray; it could be somewhere quiet and peaceful where we are conscious that we are in the presence of God. By taking time to connect with God we will be better able to share the Good News that St Paul proclaimed to the Ephesians – "We are God's work of art, created in Christ Jesus to live the good life as from the beginning he had meant us to live

Holy Cross Seminary | 2025 End-of-Year Cultural Celebration


